S.487.091 CRIMINAL CODE OF CANADA

I, Andrew Mikolajewski, of the City of Winnipeg, in the Province of Manitoba, a Peace Officer, MAKE OATH AND SAY THAT:

I am a Peace Officer employed by the Winnipeg Police Service for 15 years and I hold the rank of Detective Sergeant. I currently possess a Master's Degree in Sociology, with a primary focus on Criminal Deviance. I have been assigned to the Criminal Investigation Division for the past 16 months for the purpose of reinvestigating the murder of Barbara Stoppel.

I have personal knowledge of the facts hereinafter deposed to except where same are stated to be based upon information and belief and in which case I also believe the facts to be true and accurate. Except where specifically stated, all events occurred in the City of Winnipeg and were investigated by members of the Winnipeg Police Service.

BACKGROUND

At approximately 8:45p.m. December 23rd 1981, sixteen year old Barbara Gayle Stoppel was found strangled in the woman's washroom of the Ideal Donut Shop at 49 Goulet Street. This is the Dominion Shopping Centre at Goulet and Main Street at the foot of the Norwood Bridge. At the time of the murder the shopping centre also contained such stores as Consumers, Dominion, McDonalds Restaurant, and a Domo Gas station.

Barbara Stoppel was rushed to St. Boniface Hospital where she was put on life support, however due to a lack of oxygen it was determined that she had suffered massive brain damage. She died a few days later when her life support systems were disconnected.

There were numerous witnesses who either saw the murder suspect enter, leave or walk about inside the donut shop with Barbara Stoppel. However, the suspect escaped unidentified, as the witnesses did not know that a crime was being committed.

This suspect was described as:

Male, white, 21-30 years old, 6'1" – 6'3" in height, slim build 145 – 185 pounds) brown hair (possibly with a reddish tinge), scruffy looking with scraggly sideburns, poor complexion with some noticeable acne pimples or pock marks on the left side of his face, longish brown moustache (fu-Manchu style), wearing prescription glasses, a dark brown or black cowboy hat, a dark coloured waist length coat, blue jeans and round toed cowboy boots. He may also have been wearing a pair of black/white work gloves, a pair of tan leather gloves and/or a ring on the ring finger of his left hand.

These witnesses subsequently assisted in the preparation of a composite drawing of the suspect by a Forensic Artist which was circulated to the media on December 30, 1981.

The murder weapon was found to be a 40" piece of braided green and yellow nylon twine which was knotted around the victims neck. The original investigation determined that Powers Twine of Everson, Washington, had produced such a rope in the United States. It was made for several Canadian rope distributors in the Vancouver area who had contracts with B.C. hydro to supply shot line, used for pulling wires through conduit. As a result Winnipeg Police focused on suspects who had connections to B.C. Hydro or the Province of British Columbia.

One suspect that came to light was 28-year old Thomas Sophonow. Thomas Sophonow matched the description of the suspect and the composite produced by Police, travelled frequently between Vancouver and Winnipeg and was in Winnipeg on the day of the murder. Thomas Sophonow was subsequently charged with the murder of Barbara Stoppel on March 13, 1982, however he has steadfastly denied his involvement in this crime since that date.

On December 12, 1985, after several court proceedings, the Manitoba Court of Appeal acquitted Thomas Sophonow of murdering Barbara Stoppel. The Supreme Court of Canada in a unanimous decision released on April 22, 1986 upheld the acquittal. As a result the murder of Barbara Stoppel remains unsolved to this date.

On June 15, 1999, Constable John Burchill, a Major Crimes Analyst with the City of Winnipeg Police Service, was assigned by the Executive of the Police Service to review and analyze the investigation into the murder Barbara Stoppel. During the course of this review it was determined that one Terry Samuel ARNOLD presented himself as a more viable suspect than Thomas Sophonow

On October 12th 1999 Sergeant Blair Vogen, Detective Sergeant Bob Legge and the writer were assigned to continue the investigation into the Barbara Stoppel Homicide as it pertained to the analysis report prepared by Constable Burchill. During the course of this review we have concluded that

Thomas SOPHONOW IS NOT responsible for the Murder of Barbara STOPPEL.

Further, I have reasonable and probable grounds for believing that Terry Samuel ARNOLD, at the City of Winnipeg aforesaid, on or about the 23rd day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighty-one, did unlawfully kill Barbara Gayle STOPPEL, and did thereby commit murder in the first degree contrary to the provisions of the Criminal Code of Canada;

Hereinafter the grounds for this belief are as follows:

1. On December 28th 1981, members of the Winnipeg Police Service interviewed Muriel Stoppel, Barbara's mother, at her home. During the conversation Muriel Stoppel informed them that while at the hospital that day she had met a male who had come to visit Barbara. This person who identified himself as Terry ARNOLD of suite 9 – 25 Cromwell said **that he was a truck driver** who frequents the Ideal Donut Shop and had got to know and converse with Barbara. Muriel Stoppel did not particularly think that ARNOLD looked like the suspect but believed, as a regular customer, that he might be able to help the investigation.
2. On December 29th, 1981 Police attended to suite 9 – 25 Cromwell and interviewed Terry ARNOLD. They showed him a copy of the composite drawing but he could not identify it as anyone he knew. The officers did feel that **ARNOLD was somewhat similar in appearance** to the composite (although he had a smaller moustache and was a little heavier in the face).

Police further reported that on this same date they interviewed 49-year old Garnet LaPierre who is a regular at the Ideal Donut Shop and had been in the shop at about 11:30 on the day of the murder. He informed the officers that there were about 7 other customers in the shop. The radio was playing Christmas carols. When a country-western song came on one of the patrons sitting by him said something like, "I see somebody likes my country and western music". It was said loud enough that everybody could hear but was directed at no one.

Because of the persons unusual mannerisms LaPierre took notice of this male and described him as being:

22-26years, 5'11", medium build, pock marks on the left side of his face, moustache, no glasses, and no beard. He was wearing a brown cowboy hat with a similarly coloured feather in the band on the left side, and a dark blue or black ski jacket, believed to be an inexpensive down filled, (not the "puffy" down filled) and blue jeans.

LaPierre viewed the composite without the glasses and stated that it looked like the male, however the moustache was shorter than the composite, the hat is the same and the composite itself is a good likeness. **LaPierre was never shown a photo line-up with Terry ARNOLD's picture in it.**

3. On February 12th, 1985 two witnesses whose identity it is not in the Police interest to divulge at this time , reported that on the afternoon of the murder they had been in the Ideal Donut Shop located at 49 Goulet Street and observed Terry ARNOLD inside the store speaking with Barbara Stoppel. **They stated that ARNOLD appeared to know Barbara Stoppel and was bothering her.** They described ARNOLD as wearing glasses, a cowboy hat, cowboy boots and a short jacket. One of the witnesses knew Terry ARNOLD as another tenant in her apartment block and considered him as a possible suspect.

The aforementioned information only came to the attention of the police on February 15th, 2000, when the writer obtained full disclosure of all Thomas Sophonow's legal files from his current lawyer, Paul Bennett in Toronto. The writer has seized and is in possession of the original statements of both these witnesses.

4. On December 30th, 1981 Winnipeg Police interviewed a Scott Pickall who informed them that after observing the composite on the television he felt that an acquaintance of his, Terry ARNOLD, fit the description. His facial features were generally the same. He had the same moustache, was 6'2", eyeglasses, who regularly wears a cowboy hat and cowboy boots. Pickall felt that he is capable of such a violent act. He gave them an address of suite 22 – 250 Furby Street for ARNOLD.

When Police attended to suite 22 – 250 Furby Street they found that ARNOLD had moved a few months earlier. The caretaker Lila LASKO (who has now been determined to be Lila PATON, Terry ARNOLD's aunt), was shown the composite. **She felt that Terry ARNOLD was heavier in the face, but stated that he did wear cowboy boots and that the cowboy hat was similar to one that he regularly wore.**

5. Police members subsequently viewed ARNOLD's Winnipeg Police Gallery photo and found that he was similar in appearance, but at 5'11", 196 lbs, he was slightly shorter than the suspect. However they note that with cowboy boots and a cowboy hat that he would appear much taller.

6. Police then attended to suite 9 – 25 Cromwell and spoke with Terry ARNOLD's mother. She told them to check the Salisbury House at Portage and Camden where his girlfriend "Jackie" worked. **They took note of the fact that the apartment block at 25 Cromwell has a direct view of the Ideal Donut Shop.**

7. On December 31st, 1981 Police went to the Salisbury House and located Terry ARNOLD. **They found him to be somewhat similar in appearance to the composite,** he was 5'11", 180lbs, short brown hair, moustache, dark framed glasses, noticeable acne on his face, and although 19 years old he appeared older.

8. ARNOLD was informed as to why they were there and asked him to accompany them back to the police station. ARNOLD replied that plainclothes officers had already spoken to him a few days earlier after he had visited Barbara Stoppel in the hospital out of concern. A search of a briefcase ARNOLD was carrying produced a diary in which there was one entry, that entry being from December 29th, 1981, in which he noted that two undercover officers had come to speak with him about the murder of Barbara Stoppel. **It is the writers opinion that this "Documentation" is consistent with what an offender of this kind would make.**

9. ARNOLD told the police to check with the staff at the Salisbury House as they could verify his whereabouts on the night of the murder. Police subsequently went back to the restaurant and spoke with a 35 year old female by the name of Jackie whose last name it is not in the interest of Police to divulge at this time but whose information has been found to be reliable. She informed them that ARNOLD had been coming to the restaurant for about 1 month. That he was a regular every night, sometimes staying all night. On the night of the murder she arrived at work at 10:30 – 11:00pm and ARNOLD was already there. She does not know what time he arrived. None of the other employees could offer anything else.

When they questioned Terry ARNOLD further he indicated that he had been in custody at the Public Safety Building from September through to December 15th, 1981. That when he had been arrested his cowboy hat went missing, since then he had not had one. ARNOLD did, however, indicate that on December 23rd, 1981 at about 1:30pm he went to the Dominion Store for milk and bread but did not go into the donut shop. **In essence**

ARNOLD places himself near the Murder scene on the day of the offence.

10, ARNOLD subsequently indicated that after shopping he went home and fell asleep, advising his mother to wake him at 8:00pm. He was awakened at that time and shortly after received a ride downtown from his mother's friend Reggie Davies who dropped him off near the NorthStar Inn (Delta Winnipeg), and from there took a transit bus to the Salisbury House, at Portage and Camden arriving at about 8:40-8:45pm (coincidentally the exact time of the murder). He denied being involved in the murder.

Police contacted ARNOLD's mother, Donna Barbe, who indicated that she had been sick and does not recall anything about December 23rd, 1981. She did know that her son has not worn a cowboy hat for the past couple of months since he was in jail at the Public Safety Building. The officers then spoke with Reggie Davies who confirmed that he had given Terry ARNOLD a ride to the NorthStar Inn, but he could not remember which day of the week it was. He also confirmed that ARNOLD had not worn a cowboy hat since he was released from jail.

11. Police spoke with Velma Sutton and Renita Woods, the two waitresses who worked the evening shift at the Salisbury House on December 23rd, 1981. Neither recalled Terry ARNOLD having been in the premises and did not know who he was.

12. On January 21st, 2000, I spoke with 53-year old Jackie who worked at the Salisbury House at Portage and Camden. In this conversation she stated that she had only known Terry ARNOLD for 2 to 4 weeks prior to the murder and that she considered herself a friend and nothing more.

She advised that ARNOLD had come in to the restaurant between 2 – 4am on December 24th, 1981 and had not been there when she came to work contrary to her initial statement to Police in 1982. She recalled that **ARNOLD had been shaking that night and**

appeared very nervous. She remembered he was wearing a cowboy hat. He wouldn't tell her where he got it but she recalled seeing him wearing it twice before.

She stated that ARNOLD told her to tell anybody who asked that he "had been waiting in the Salisbury House when she came on shift". He said that, "Someone was trying to set him up, that it was family problems, they just want to put us away." When she questioned him further he said, "You know me I wouldn't tell you something that wasn't so". When she asked what would happen if she forgot, he said, "You just better not forget", which made her feel threatened. **When the Police interviewed her a few days later she had said that Terry was there when she arrived for work. This was a lie.**

13. "Jackie" stated that ARNOLD stayed there until the end of her shift and then wanted to leave with her, which she would not allow. In the weeks following the murder the topic would come up in the restaurant and Terry would say, **"I'm sure she [Barbara Stoppel] deserves all she gets. The guy who murdered her, she must have teased him and she deserves all she got. I'm sure she deserved it"**.

14. On December 31, 1981, after seeing the composite drawing of the suspect in the newspaper, Bettiann Commodore, the manager of the Salisbury House at Camden and Portage, reported to the police that one of her waitresses ("Jackie") had been seeing a male named "Terry" who matched the description. **She advised that this male always wore a cowboy hat, but for the past several nights had worn a black toque.** It appears that Commodore was never interviewed by Police.

15. On December 31, 1981 at 12:55pm, shortly after his interview with Police, ARNOLD called the police from the McDonald's restaurant at 79 Goulet Street (at the Dominion Shopping Centre) and identified a Robert Fournier as a possible suspect in the murder of Barbara Stoppel. The police subsequently interviewed Fournier, who was similar in appearance to the composite drawing. However he was eliminated as a suspect due to his

height (he was only 5'7"). **It is the writer's opinion that ARNOLD was attempting to divert attention away from himself by implicating another person.**

16. On January 3rd, 1982 Police interviewed 16-year old James Septon. Septon related that on New Years Eve he had been at a party and overheard a conversation from which he learned that a possible suspect lived on Cromwell Street. On January 2nd, 1982 at about 6:30pm he and a friend were in his vehicle when they observed a male matching the description off the composite walk down the street and go into 25 Cromwell. Police subsequently went to 25 Cromwell and determined that this person was Terry ARNOLD. **They were of the opinion that he did fit the description of the composite, but learned that he had already been spoken to on several occasions by the police and did not investigate further.**

17. On January 4th, 1982, Terry Barbe, of suite 9-25 Cromwell, reported to the police that an acquaintance informed him that he recognized the picture of the male wanted for the murder of Barbara Stoppel, but would not contact Police, as he feared for his life if the male learned of it. It should be noted that 9-25 Cromwell was Terry ARNOLD's address and that "Barbe" was his mother's surname at that time. **It is the writer's opinion that ARNOLD was again attempting to divert attention away from himself by implicating another person.**

18. On January 17th, 1982 Police re-interviewed Terry ARNOLD. During this interview ARNOLD advised that he had met Barbara Stoppel shortly after his release from the Remand Center on December 15, 1981 when he went to the donut shop for coffee. He saw her only 2 or 3 times prior to her death. He admitted to once having a crush on Barbara Stoppel, so he went to the hospital to check on her condition. This is when he met Muriel Stoppel.

It is my opinion that this does not appear to be a genuine concern on ARNOLDS part since;

- a) He indicates that he has only known her for a short period of time.
- b) His psychological profile presents him as focussing on "I" and "me" and not "others" least of all what could be labeled a "generalized other."

It may be presented that ARNOLD at this time is not concerned for her well being but rather for his own. **If she recovers he may be discovered.**

19. On January 22nd 1982 Winnipeg Police were called to the Dominion Store, 43 Marion (Dominion Shopping Centre) regarding a male who had information on the Stoppel murder. The male was not there but had identified himself as Terry ARNOLD over the phone. They subsequently attended to 9 – 25 Cromwell where they found both ARNOLD and his mother Donna Barbe. Mrs. Barbe told the officers that when detectives had questioned her they had asked her about an older male with white hair and beard. She assumed this was the male responsible for the murder and had told her son. When Terry was at the Dominion Store he saw someone matching this description and called police. **It is the writer's opinion that ARNOLD was again attempting to divert attention away from himself by implicating another person.**

20. On January 24th, 1982, an anonymous female called the police to say that she had seen the person responsible for the murder of the Stoppel girl. This person had been at the Salisbury House (Sherbrook & Broadway) on two separate occasions. The first time was about two weeks previous at which time he was wearing the cowboy hat and the

described clothing. The second occasion was on January 22nd, 1982 sometime after 9:00pm. The male was wearing the same clothing except for the cowboy hat, this time he was wearing a multi coloured toque (similar to that described by Bettiann Commodore). The male's name was apparently "Terry", he was about 29 years old, wore glasses and had a moustache. While only 19 years old at the time ARNOLD appeared much older.

21. The writer has reviewed ARNOLD's police Dossier that contains copies of old police investigative reports. The writer noted that Terry ARNOLD was involved with the police on several occasions shortly before the murder of Barbara Stoppel. **One three occasions between June and October of 1981, he was wearing a cowboy hat. Further, his Dossier showed that he did not possess a Manitoba Drivers License that would allow him to be a truck driver as he mentioned to Muriel Stoppel.** It would appear that ARNOLDS drivers status was not checked by Police resulting in his apparent lie not being uncovered.

22. Although ARNOLD stated that he had once had a crush on Barbara STOPPEL, it would appear that he did not have enough time after his release from the Remand Centre to develop a normal crush on her. However, during the review of ARNOLD's police Dossier it was discovered that Conklin Shows at the Red River Exhibition employed him during the summer of 1981. **It was learned from Richard Stoppel, the victim's brother, during an interview with the writer in November 1999, that Barbara had also worked at the Red River Exhibition at that same time.** As such ARNOLD may have previously met Barbara Stoppel and developed a crush on her at that time.

23. Background reports and subsequent psychological workbooks suggest that Arnold presented himself as a classic Psychopath who would be drawn to pretty young women. A friendly glance would be suggestive of a longing relationship while any form of denial would imply rejection. Rejection in turn would give rise to rage.

24. Terry ARNOLD has a history of violence against women. On March 2nd, 1982 Police reports indicate that Terry ARNOLD got into an argument with 19-year old female about her possible romantic involvement with his 14 year old brother Lynn. The female and Lynn left the apartment. Outside, they were confronted by an enraged Terry ARNOLD who pushed her down. **She struck her head and stomach on the pavement. She was 5 months pregnant at the time.**

On June 1st 2000 the writer met with this same female, who I believe to be reliable. She remembered speaking with ARNOLD'S sister Tracey days after the Murder of Barbara STOPPEL. **She recalls Tracey telling her that Terry was a suspect in the STOPPEL murder because "Terry was in the Donut shop that night."** She was extremely agitated when talking about Terry and began to shake when shown his picture that was taken around the time of the murder.

25. On January 21st, 1983 at about 3:23am, Police attended to 179 Battery, the home of Victoria Spakowski. At the door of the residence they found Terry ARNOLD. He informed them that Victoria was his ex-girlfriend that he had not seen her in over a year, but recently found out where she lived and wanted to rekindle the relationship. They spoke with Victoria who acknowledged knowing Terry ARNOLD but was married now and wanted nothing to do with him. ARNOLD was subsequently warned under the Petty Trespass Act.

On February 27th, 1983 at about 1:55pm Terry ARNOLD called Dale McMillan who is the husband of Victoria Spakowski. He identified himself as "Terry" and said, "I've got a 22 and I'm going to blow you all away." Victoria Spakowski got on the phone at which time Terry ARNOLD stated, **"Your baby's dead too."** Spakowski immediately recognized Terry's voice as she had lived with him for 3 ½ months. ARNOLD was subsequently arrested for Uttering Threats to Kill. He pled guilty and received a 2 year suspended sentence with supervision.

26. On June 21th 2000 the writer met with Spakowski in Calgary. According to SPAKOWSKI Terry ARNOLD presented himself as a very disturbed person heavily involved in drugs and alcohol. At the time she knew him he always wore a knife on his belt and bragged that Police could not take it from him since it was under the legal length. **She also recalls ARNOLD wearing a cowboy hat and that he wore cowboy boots. ARNOLD also liked country music and his favorite snack food was red pastachios. Both of these characteristics are shared by the "Cowboy" seen in the Ideal Donut shop on the day of the murder.**

SPAKOWSKI also advised the writer of numerous disturbing facts concerning ARNOLD. Of particular note Terry brought up the subject of having children and that if they had a boy he would expect her to have sex with the child as this was the proper way to teach sex. **If however they had a girl it would be his duty to have sex with their daughter.**

27. On May 17th, 1983 ARNOLD and his wife of two months Eileen, went to her uncle's house and stole some belongings. When confronted by the uncle Terry ARNOLD jumped him. During the scuffle he bit the uncles face just below the left eye. The uncle tried to leave but ARNOLD grabbed a 12" serrated bread knife and pursued him and his children threatening them over and over again that he was going to kill them. Terry ARNOLD was charged with Possession of Stolen Property, A.C.B.H. and Possession of a Dangerous Weapon. This again demonstrates ARNOLDS propensity to violence.

28. The writer has been informed by Detective Lance Colby a 22 year member of the Calgary Police Service, presently assigned to the Vice Unit that in June 1997 he began investigating the murder of Denise Noel Lapierre. Lapierre was an attractive 17-year old girl who was found murdered on June 21st, 1987.

A canvass of the area showed that Denise Lapierre would have walked directly in front of Terry ARNOLD's residence at 139 - 21st Avenue North East on her way home from a party the last time she was seen alive. Her badly beaten body was found in the lane 3 houses away. ARNOLDS remains the prime suspect in this case.

29. On May 13th, 1988 Constable Morgan of the Chilliwack RCMP received a complaint from Katerine Beaupre that an unknown male had sexually assaulted her 14 and 15 year old daughters and a friend earlier that day. As a result of the description provided by the girls Terry ARNOLD was arrested in the Tamahi Creek Campground near Chilliwack. He provided a statement to police confirming what the girls had said other than the sexual contact. Terry ARNOLD received 3 months and 1 year probation. He was released on August 6th, 1988.

30. The writer has also read reports submitted by R.C.M.P. Sergeant Brent Bloxham a 24-year member assigned to the Chilliwack Detachment. He is involved in an investigation regarding the disappearance of Roberta Ferguson from the Cultus Lake / Chilliwack area in August of 1988.

Roberta Ferguson, an attractive 20-year old native girl, was camping at Cultus Lake with eight other students and two teachers from the Fraser Valley West United Native Nations Local 103. They were camping at the Sunnyside Campground from August 23rd 1988 to August 25th, 1988. Roberta Ferguson disappeared after supper on August 24th, when she presumably left to walk to the bus depot and head home to Surrey.

At the time that Roberta Ferguson went missing Terry ARNOLD was either living at the Sleepy Hollow Trailer Park or on the Chilliwack RV Campground. The Sleepy Hollow Trailer Park is about 2 blocks from where Roberta Ferguson was camping. During the week that Roberta Ferguson went missing Terry ARNOLD changed his appearance, by shaving his facial hair and cutting his long shoulder length hair very short above the ears.

He would often dress in a shirt and tie, dress slacks and loafers. Roberta Ferguson has never been found and is presumed dead. **Terry ARNOLD is considered a suspect in her disappearance.**

31. On December 8th, 1988, shortly after his release from jail and Roberta Ferguson's disappearance, ARNOLD allegedly sexually assaulted 16-year old Doreena Green, also of Chilliwack. Green reported to the RCMP that she had met ARNOLD the previous day when he stopped his truck and offered to give her a ride to school. Green accepted and gave ARNOLD her phone number. The next day he called her, picked her up in his truck and took her to a trailer park where he raped her. Although Green tried to fight back ARNOLD threatened to hurt her and put his hands around her throat and started to choke her. He then took her to a wooded area where he told her that she would not be coming back as he could not trust her to keep quiet. After promising she wouldn't tell anyone, ARNOLD released her. ARNOLD was subsequently arrested and while he admitted to picking up Green, he denied raping her.

32. I have further read a report from the R.C.M.P. in Keremeos, British Columbia, which states that they interviewed 40-year old Jewel Clark. She reported that on March 6th, 1991 Terry ARNOLD, her boyfriend, wanted to go to the "Red Bridge". When she didn't he became very insistent and she became afraid and got into a car to escape. When he blocked her way she went to a neighbors house and knocked at the door. ARNOLD grabbed her and carried her back to her residence. He locked all the doors and forced her into the bedroom. **He then braced the door with a chair and forced sexual intercourse on her.**

On March 16th, 1991 when she was trying to break up with her boyfriend Terry ARNOLD, he had told her, **"I'll be back and you'll regret it when I see you again. I'm not going to leave you alone."** Two months later, on May 21st, 1991, Terry ARNOLD was at the home of Jewel Clark. He forced her into the bedroom where he again forced intercourse

on her. She was only able to escape by saying that she had to go to the washroom. **Jewel Clark refused to have ARNOLD charged, as she fears for her safety.**

33. In June 1991 Terry ARNOLD murdered 16-year old Christine Brown, a crime he was arrested for in 1997 and convicted of in 1999. He is currently serving a life sentence with no chance of parole for 25 years. **I have viewed video taped evidence of Terry ARNOLD admitting to the rape and Murder of Christine Browne.** He has appealed his conviction but the Court of Appeal has yet to make its decision. ARNOLD is still in custody at William Head Institution in British Columbia.

34. Between July 8th and July 11th, 1991, after arriving in Newfoundland from B.C., Terry ARNOLD had forced sexual intercourse with two young girls and oral intercourse with another while in his vehicle in Springdale, Newfoundland. **The girls were aged 10, 12 and 14 years old.** ARNOLD was identified by the girls, arrested and on December 6th, 1991, he found guilty and sentenced to 6 years in custody. He served his complete sentence in custody at Dorchester Penitentiary being released in April 1997.

35. On December 8th 1994, while in custody at Dorchester Penitentiary, Constable Doody of the R.C.M.P. interviewed ARNOLD with respect to the Christine Browne murder. During this interview ARNOLD stopped Constable Doody and said, "Have you heard of Thomas Sophonow?" Doody responded "No". ARNOLD replied, **"Thomas Sophonow was a guy in Winnipeg, who murdered a girl in a restaurant with some rope. He tied her up with some rope, tied her up with a rope or something... and the rope was identified to be from B.C. Hydro and he worked for B.C. Hydro. He was subsequently convicted and he says he didn't do it and later on it was found out that he didn't do it... even though he was convicted... alright."** In the context of the interview ARNOLD was discussing wrongful arrests and convictions, however the writer finds it odd that 12-years earlier ARNOLD had attempted to provide information to police implying Sophonow's guilt.

On February 15th 2000 I received information documenting the following; That on February 27th 1983 while in custody in the Winnipeg Remand Center Terry **ARNOLD** attempted to have his **Criminal charges stayed in return for providing evidence against Thomas SOPHONOW** that he confessed to killing Barbara **STOPPEL**.

On March 25th 2000 I showed Thomas SOPHONOW several photographs of Terry ARNOLD and asked if he had ever seen him to which he responded that he had not. I then advised SOPHONOW of the allegations made by ARNOLD which resulted in a firm emotional response,

"HE'S A LIAR"

36. The writer has read the Dorchester Regional Treatment Centre, sex offender, psychological reports relating to Terry ARNOLD dated from January 5th, 1993 to February 14th, 1996. The reports were prepared by Dr. Bernard Galameau, M.A.Ps, Licensed Psychologist and Dr. Michele Nadeau, M.A.Ps., Psychological consultant, DSOP Therapist.

The writer has read Terry ARNOLD's "Greenbook", which is a workbook that Galameau and Nadeau used when working with Terry ARNOLD in the sex offender program. The exercises and topics were part of relapse prevention. They were to teach the offender to recognize his risk factors both external and internal and to teach them strategies for coping with these factors. The exercises were designed for the offender (Terry ARNOLD) to draw on past experiences and on areas that he would consider being risk factors.

The writer found a number of comments made by Terry ARNOLD in his "Greenbook" to be very interesting - during an assignment on Risk Factors he lists the following places; swimming pools, beaches, porno theatres, playgrounds, parks, small towns, cub/scout groups, schools discotechs, dark areas, drinking spots, bars, campgrounds and **female washrooms**. Barbara STOPPEL was Murdered in a female Washroom.

During the same assignment he was asked to write down sexual stimuli. Under smells he writes; sweat on an exercising woman, vaginal secretions like after a woman just had sex, nice perfumes, soapy clean females, nice smelling shampoo in a female's hair. During the same exercise he lists the following events that he considers High Risk Factors; carnival, circus woman having sex with another man/woman, move to a new area, get beat up or put down, attempt suicide, break up. Both Christine Browne and Barbara STOPPEL worked at Carnivals.

During an assignment on approaching a victim he writes seeing a potential victim in a situation where she could be victimized, planning a sex crime where I know the victim. In this same assignment he talks about setting up a victim and writes; **"get to know a female better, see what her weak points are emotionally and exploiting them to my advantage. Get her alone, be extra nice to her, delude myself into thinking she wants me, be selfish, and not think about her feelings"**.

37. I have also spoken with Dr. Adriana Celser, a psychologist with the Calgary Police Service. She has over 20 years experience as a psychologist. She has been with Calgary Police since 1996 and is the manager of their Psychological Services Section. She advises that she has been involved with the Denise Lapierre murder case since it was opened. She has information on all facets of the case and Terry ARNOLD's background. As such she has formed an opinion on Terry ARNOLD.

Dr. Celser's opinion is that ARNOLD is highly manipulative, pays attention to details and has an above average IQ. He is someone who gains more knowledge with each crime that he commits, and learns how to do the crime better each time. He will grow more confident each time he commits a crime. He acts out through imitation, he is not creative, and will

make mistakes because of poor judgment. He has learned to read situations and take advantage of the opportunity as it arises to commit a crime. He does not plan them but imitates, possibly from watching television. He has the emotional level of a two year old and is pleased by primitive things.

38. On March 9th 2000 detectives Brown/Allan of the Winnipeg Police Service interviewed Terry ARNOLD in Mission Institution where he admits being in the Ideal donut shop but only **“when it was busy”**. ARNOLD also denied knowing Barbara STOPPEL from the Red River exhibition.

39. During this same interview ARNOLD initially denies working at the Red River X until being shown his arrest photo from 1981 wearing a shirt with the Conkilyn emblem on same. At this point he admits working there during that summer but defensively asserts **“But never at a games booth.”** The writer finds it odd that ARNOLD would draw attention away from the games booth when this is in fact where STOPPEL worked (And he had NOT been advised of this by Police). It is the writer opinion that this implies knowledge of Barbara STOPPEL at this time.

40. Since the murder of Barbara Stoppel, Terry ARNOLD has been convicted of numerous sexual assaults of other teenage girls. He has also been arrested for other sexual assaults of young women, where charges were never laid. The assaults had been precipitated by feelings of rejection on ARNOLD's part and ended in acts of rage and violence against those he feel's have rejected him.

41. On March 11th 2000 members of the Winnipeg Police Service executed a search warrant at 7, 6220-17th Avenue S/E in Calgary Alberta (The residence of Donna Borchert-Terry ARNOLDS mother). The writer was seeking written materials of ARNOLDS which may hide information concerning his involvement in the Murder of Barbara STOPPEL and others listed herein. As a result I seized the following;

-Typed story "THE GREEKS" by Terry ARNOLD containing the saying "IF YOU CAN'T FUCK IT, THEN KILL IT". ARNOLD implies his admiration for this philosophy and his criminal history may suggest his adherence to it.

-Assorted Sex Offender writings of Terry ARNOLD which reveal his deviance and thought process prior to and after offending.

-"Anger Book" of Terry ARNOLD. ARNOLD writes "**WHEN A WOMAN WAS SEXUALLY TEASING ME I GOT ANGRY WITH HER AND RAPED HER.**" It should be noted that ARNOLD told "Jackie" at the Salisbury house that STOPPEL was a tease and deserved it.

-Story written by ARNOLD titled "The Beginning". In chapter 2 the main character goes to a morning restaurant where a pretty blond waitress serves him as he sits at a bar like counter. It continues..."**HE WATCHED THE WAITRESS WALK OFF TO COLLECT HIS ORDER AND OBSERVED HER BEHIND SWAYING COYLY. HE FELT A STIRRING IN HIS LOINS AS HE THOUGHT ABOUT HOW SHE MIGHT BE AFTER A FEW COCKTAILS AND DINNER.**"

-"The Cryonic Iceman" written by Terry ARNOLD. In one section ARNOLD vividly describes a murder... "**HE FELT THE GARROTE TIGHTEN AROUND HIS NECK FROM BEHIND. HE TRIED TO SCREAM BUT COULD NOT FORCE ANY AIR PAST THE WIRE AROUND HIS WINDPIPE. LYNN FELT HIS EYES BULDGE OUT AS THE WIRE TORE INTO HIS NECK MUSCLES. HE SCRAPED AND TORE AT IT TRYING TO TWIST AROUND IN HIS SEAT IN THOSE LAST FEW SECONDS OF DESPERATION, THE BLOOD POUNDING IN HIS HEAD. HE FELT HIS TONGUE DART OUT FROM BETWEEN HIS TEETH AS HE LOST CONSCIOUSNESS, HIS ARMS FALLING BESIDE HIM TWITCHING.**"

42. On March 28th 2000 the STOPPEL family was advised that Terry Samuel ARNOLD was the prime suspect in the Murder of Barbara. They did not recall his name nor could they identify him from photographs. On March 29th 2000 Richard STOPPEL turned over a piece of paper to me with the following writing;

Terry ARNOLD

9-25 Cromwell St.

237-5473

Mrs. Donna Barbe-Mother

STOPPEL found this note in a box his mother Muriel had kept containing cards and regrets from the time of STOPPELS murder.

43. On July 5th 2000 in company with Detective Sergeant Paul Brown the writer executed a search warrant at Mission Institution where ARNOLD was being lodged. ARNOLD was brought to an interview room where we were waiting which resulted in him running away to his segregation Cell which he found to be locked. ARNOLD presented himself in a fearful manner and then became enraged with officers threatening to "RIP THEIR HEADS OFF".

At the completing of the warrant ARNOLD agreed to attend to an interview room. At this time he was shown a photocopy of the note found by the STOPPELS and the circumstances. ARNOLD replied "I've only sent flowers twice and I remember both." Police had made no indication that the note was sent with flowers.

SUMMARY

After having reviewed the information provided to me and based on my own investigative research and personal knowledge of Criminal Deviancy, I am of the opinion that Terry Samuel ARNOLD murdered Barbara STOPPEL.

Analysis of the crime scene at the time of the murder revealed an unidentified palm print on the crash bar inside the Ideal Donut shop at the Dominion shopping center.

I reasonably believe that information concerning the offence will be obtained through the use of a device, investigative technique or procedure being:


Obtaining inked right and left palm impressions of Terry Samuel ARNOLD suitable for comparison purposes.

It is my intention of attending William Head Institution on Vancouver Island accompanied by Detective Sergeants Murray Allan, Paul Brown and Robert Legge and to, take custody of him to the identification facility of the Institution and request inked right and left palm impressions. If he will not provide these impressions voluntarily then it is my intention to use as much force as is necessary to obtain them.


I believe obtaining the necessary palm print impressions is a simple procedure involving at most minor, if any, discomfort and would not be considered as interfering with his bodily integrity. In fact, the taking of inked palm impressions is a routine procedure already carried out under the Identifications of Criminals Act. However, there is presently no other provision in any Act of Parliament that permits the use of this technique or procedure to be used or done without the suspect first being criminally charged.

Therefore I request that an impression Warrant, pursuant to Section 487.091 of the Criminal Code Of Canada, be granted to use this investigative technique or procedure to obtain information concerning the offence.
